## **MAJOR DISASTERS AND RESPONSES**

(From October 11-15, 1999)

### **OROMIA**

In Omo Locality, in Omonada Wereda of Jimma Zone, due to the long dry spell which has also caused the death of animals, 917 people are facing food shortages. In the other areas where food shortages had been reported earlier food is being distributed but still more food is required to sustain the intervention.

In Dodota Sorie, Tiyo, Digelu, Jijo and Munisa weredas of Arsi Zone, food shortages are being witnessed especially in the highlands.

### **SPNNR**

240 animals, including 200 chickens, have been killed and an unspecified number of household utensils and clothes, including 20 bee hives, have been washed away by floods caused by rains that fell from October 1-7, 1999 in Haddiya Zone.

Similarly, 28 animals were killed, 3 houses and 4 wooden bridges were destroyed by a landslide which followed the heavy rains that fell on October 3, 1999. Crops on 6 hectares of land also sustained 80-100% damage.
