# **MAJOR DISASTERS AND RESPONSES**

(From April 10-14, 2000)

## **AMHARA**

In South Wello Zone, torrential rain that fell for two hours on 31 March 2000 caused severe damage to houses and vegetable crops. Animals were also affected.

There has been no rain in three weredas in Oromia zone so far so men as well as animals are affected.

## **OROMIA**

131 heads of households have left 5 peasant associations in Abichugna Wereda of North Shewa Zone in search of work. The same phenomenon is being observed in the rest of the weredas and it is felt that unless appropriate measures are taken in time, this will lead to mass migration and death.

Due to the serious shortage of pasture in the low-lying areas of Bale Zone, animals are beginning to die in Medewelebu, Raitu, Goro and Sewena weredas.

Food is being distributed among the needy in Golelcha Gassera, Sewena, Beltu, Ginir, Raitu, Goro and Gurra Damolie weredas. Also, water tankering was carried out between February 12, 2000 and April 10, 2000 for the Beredentu area in Raitu Wereda and 557,660 liters of water was distributed. NCA distributed an additional 66,000 liters to the Hallochema, Budicha and Areda peasant associations from March 24, 2000 to April 10, 2000 while 9000 liters of water was distributed to three localities in Goro Wereda using a tanker that came there to extinguish forest fires.

In Borena Zone, the rain has mitigated the water shortage, but still animals are dying because of lack of pasture.

In Metti Segtu and Amoduri localities in Omonada Wereda of Jimma Zone, 980 animals have died beginning December 1999 because of shortage of rain.

Emergency food aid has been requested for Golelcha and Jeju weredas of Arsi Zone.
