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DPPC Fortnight Bulletin updates readers on what DPPC and its Partners are doing regarding Disaster Prevention and Preparedness and other related issues.

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MAJOR DISASTERS AND RESPONSES

(From March 6-10, 2000)

AMHARA

In Kebele 03, in Bati Wereda of Oromia Zone, 3 houses were burnt and property, including animals, worth Birr 26,000 was destroyed by fire according to reports of the Wereda Council.

Due to the absence of the Belg rain, there is shortage of water and pasture in 8 weredas in North Wello Zone.

OROMIA

People are facing shortage of water in the low-lying weredas of Ziway Dugda, Dodota Sire and Munisa in Arsi Zone. It is also reported that people are moving out of Ziway Dugda because of the food shortages there.

Similarly, in Miona Hargedeb, Goro Wereda; in Korjel locality, Medwelebu Wereda and in Raitu and Sewina weredas, shortage of water and pasture has become serious. And in Ginir, Goro, Gura Damole and Golelcha Gasera weredas, lactating mothers and children are showing signs of malnutrition and there is a request for supplementary food to be sent to the affected weredas.

Water tankering was carried out from a distance of 113 km and 217,600 liters of water was distributed in Raitu wereda between February 12 and March 7, 2000.

In Yabello, Teitele, Arero and Dire weredas of Borena zone, fodder and water are being supplied because of the serious shortage of pasture and water. In 10 weredas of this zone, food assistance is being carried out, but more food is needed.

Food has been sent to Siraro, Arsi Negele, Adami Tulu and Jido Kombolcha weredas of East Shewa Zone but still more food is required.
