## MAJOR DISASTERS AND RESPONSES

(November 6-10, 2000)

### OROMIA

Heavy rains are causing damage to crops in Siraro, Arsi Negelle, Adamitullu, Jeddu, Dugda Bora, Lome, Adia Liben and Boset weredas of East Shewa Zone. The same is the case in North Shewa Zone.

Crops are being sprayed with insecticides to control betch worm and aphid infestation of the betch crop in Kuyu, Sululta Mullo, Werejarso, Degen, Yayagulele Debrelibanos, Girar Jarso and Hidebu Obote weredas, North Shewa Zone.

Animals are being affected with black leg and pastrolosis in Tulo Wereda, East Hararghe, but measures are being taken to control the disease. Also, in the low-lying area, because of lack of pasture and water animals have grown lean.

### SNNPR

Unseasonable heavy rains are causing damage to 'tef' and are rotting and causing the seed pod of pulses to burst open in Guraghe, Hadiya, KAT, Burji as well as North Omo and some weredas of Sidama while in Burji Haricot Beans and chickpeas and in Tedele and Mareko chickpeas and pepper are being destroyed by the rain.

### AMHARA

Unseasonable rains are damaging crops in Hulet Ijj Inese, Awabel and Goncha Siso Inese weredas of East Gojjam Zone. Also, red 'tef' worm has caused limited damage to the 'tef' crop in Hulet Ijj Inese and Awabel weredas.

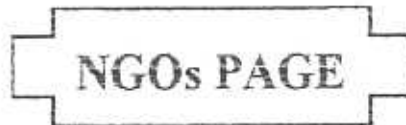
Similarly, unseasonable rain is damaging crops in most of the weredas in North Wello Zone.

And in West Gojjam Zone, the animal disease lamp skin is affecting animals.
