MAJOR DISASTERS AND RESPONSES

(From March 27-31, 2000)

SNNPR

Water is being tankered from Awassa area to the low-lying areas in Shebedino, Aleta Wendo, Dale and Awassa Zuria weredas of Sidamo Zone because of the serious shortage of water. These areas are also facing food shortages and 100 quintals of food has been bought to alleviate the situation. Besides, two localities in Shebedino and Dale weredas need emergency food assistance.

OROMIA

The food shortages in Ziway Dugda, Dodota Sire and Tiyo weredas is becoming worse, and the problem is being observed in other weredas, also.

Sululta, Mulo and Degem weredas in North Shewa zone are facing lack of pasture and water. Also, the food situation is getting more severe and those people who are being monitored are in serious need of assistance.

In Bale Zone, due to the prolonged dry spell and the lack water and pasture that it caused, animals have begun to die.

According to reports of the DPPD, in Seka Chekorsa, Gera, Limu Kosa, Limu Seka and Kersa weredas of Jimma Zone, forest fire has caused damage to natural forest and wild life, and the extent of damage is being investigated.

Food has been sent to Siraro, Arsi Negele and Adamitullu Jiddo weredas of East Shewa Zone but still more food is required. Adama and Boset weredas also need assistance.

In Liben, Shakiso, Yabello, Arero Dire, Hageremariam and Teltelle weredas of Borena Zone, animals are dying because of lack of pasture and water. So far, more than 50 animals have died.

In the low-lying weredas of Bale Trypanosomiasis is widely affecting animals.
