DPPC Fortnight Bulletin updates readers on what DPPC and its Partners are doing regarding Disaster Prevention and Preparedness and other related issues.

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MAJOR DISASTERS AND RESPONSES

(From August 7-11, 2000)

OROMIA

IN seru Wereda of Arsi Zone, the DPPD has requested for ways to be found whereby food can be transported to the area to withstand the ever worsening food shortages while the department is getting ready to conduct an assessment of reported food shortages in Munnesa and Hitosa weredas.

There is still wide spread food shortages affecting infants in the low-lying areas of Bale Zone.

In 17 localities in Dire Wereda of Borena Zone, the problem of shortage of pasture and water has become more acute. Water tankering is being carried out for only 11 of the localities using two trucks and obviously this is found to be inadequate.

In Hagere Mariam, Yabello, Shakiso, Adola, Wadera and Gelana Abaya weredas, there seems to be a malaria epidemic, but there is no medicine to cope with the problem.

The shortage of rain in the low-lying weredas of Arsi Zone is affecting crop growth while aphid infestation is being observed in Amigna and Dodota Sire weredas.

Belg crops have completely failed in the lowlands of Bale. The maize crop is wilting and drying because of lack of moisture in the mid-highland and lowland areas of Western Hararghie. The same phenomenon is being witnessed in some low-lying weredas of Borena.

HARARI

Fifty percent of the maize crop has failed due to shortage of rain and aphid infestation. Aphides have also attacked sorghum. These problems have necessitated the sowing of short cycle crops instead like wheat and haricot bean which are now being distributed to the farmers.

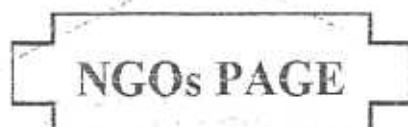
